

Dear Parents and Carers,

I hope that you had an enjoyable summer holiday; it's lovely to see the children refreshed and raring to go! Some of you know me as Miss Imam your child's year 3 teacher however, I am now Mrs Skinner! I shall be teaching year 5 along with Miss Perdicou. I am looking forward to the year ahead.

Your child's topic this half term will be

Earth and Space

Focus: Science

Year 5 will be starting their new topic this week. During this unit we will be learning to describe the movement of the Earth, and other planets, relative to the Sun in the solar system.

In addition, here is an overview of the topics that will be covered in the other curriculum areas.

Literacy	<p>The first book we will be reading is 'The Viewer' by Gary Crew.</p> <p>This term the children will be learning how to:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none">- Predict- Write from a character's perspective- Write a newspaper report- Write a diary entry- Write a sequel to the book when it is finished <p>Spelling, grammar and punctuation will continue to be taught throughout the term.</p>

PE

Your child's PE days are **Monday** and **Friday**.

Please make sure your child has their PE kit on **both** of these days.

Homework

Homework will be sent out every **Friday** and returned the following **Thursday**.

Reading

We expect that your child reads on a daily basis for 10 – 20 minutes and that you sign your child's reading log to say that they have done this. Please also discuss the book's plot and characters as well as the meaning of new words. This will help to develop comprehension skills. Please remember to reread the whole sentence once a tricky word has been solved. This helps to develop fluency. The Reading Record needs to come in every **Friday** with the whole week signed for.

Times Tables

By the end of Year 5, children are expected to know their **all** the times tables off by heart, as well as related division facts.

For example:

$$2 \times 5 = 10 \quad 5 \times 2 = 10 \quad 10 \text{ divided by } 2 = 5 \quad 10 \text{ divided by } 5 = 2$$

Please ensure your child practises the times tables on a daily basis as part of their homework routine. They will initially have a set times-table to learn a week.

Drinking water and fruit

We encourage children to drink water throughout the day. Please ensure your child brings in a **named** water bottle in school. Your child is also encouraged to bring in a piece of fruit to eat at breaktime.

Finally, I would just like to remind you that the school gates open at 8.50am each morning and that your child should be settled in class by 9am when learning starts. Please remember that the school day ends at 3.30pm and that children must be collected on time. Children will be returned to parents individually by me each day except on **Tuesday** when they will be dismissed by Coach Joe. It is important that

staff are able to prepare lessons and attend staff meetings directly after school; therefore parents of children that are collected late will be fined £10.
