





# Vivaldi's Four Seasons

# Spring


The first music piece played is called 'Spring'.



# Tempo

The word tempo means the speed of the music – is it fast, slow or somewhere in the middle?

How would you describe the tempo of 'Spring'?



The music is quite fast.

# Be a Conductor

A conductor is someone who stands in front of an orchestra and helps them play at the correct tempo. The conductor will wave their hands, or sometimes a stick called a baton.





You are going to be a conductor. Move your arm up and down in time to the music. Try to keep in time!

# Dynamics

Dynamics describe the volume of music; loud or quiet, although in music, we say 'soft' instead of 'quiet'.

The dynamics of 'Spring' change through the piece.



Listen to the music again. When the music gets loud, put your hands out wide in the air. When the music gets softer, pull your hands in close to show the change.

Vivaldi uses music to describe spring.
