
# **English Tasks Week 9 - Thursday 21st May 2020**

This week for our SPaG activity, we will be looking at conjunctions. A conjunction is a word that connects words, phrases and sentences together. Conjunctions are also known as joining words.





#### Task 2: Text map


This is a text map that tells the story of 'Where the Wild Things are'. Use this map to carry out the following tasks;



#### **Task 4: Time connectives**

Time connectives are words that join phrases or sentences together to help us understand when something is happening. Time connectives are also known as 'Time words' because they are used to sequence events in time order (chronological order) Words such as first, next, then, later, after that, just then, finally are all-time connectives.




