Everything we do at St Mary's is based on our spiritual values. Our hope is that the whole school community will adopt these and 'live out' the values in their lives.



Sickness and testing

WHAT ARE THE SYMPTOMS OF CORONAVIRUS

F YOUR CHILD HAS ANY OF THESE SYMPTOMS THEY MUST NOT COME TO SCHOOL OR IF THEY DEVELOP THEM IN SCHOOL, WILL BE SENT HOME. SIBLINGS SHOULD STAY AT HOME TOO.

- **a high temperature** this means you feel hot to touch on your chest or back (you do not need to measure your temperature)
- **a new, continuous cough** this means coughing a lot for more than an hour, or 3 or more coughing episodes in 24 hours (if you usually have a cough, it may be worse than usual)
- a loss or change to your sense of smell or taste this means you've noticed you cannot smell or taste anything, or things smell or taste different to normal

 Most people with coronavirus have at least 1 of these symptoms.

What to do if you have symptoms -If you have any of the main symptoms of coronavirus:

- 1. Get a test to check if you have coronavirus as soon as possible.
- 2. Stay at home and do not have visitors until you get your test result only leave your home to have a test.

School are happy to support you with booking a test online however, it is extremely difficult to book online at the moment. If you or your child needs to have a test we have been advised that the following places have walk in centres.
